70 Vestry, NYC The newest Robert A. M. Stern Architects project is, right om Tribeca's waterfront (above), and the 46 two- to five-bedroomi condos have oversized windows with Hudson River views. Most have terraces. Many have libraries. From \$6.25 million (Stern's projects are continually the highest per square foot in New York.); 70 vestry.com.

Palazzo del Sol, Fisher Island, Miami The first new construction since 2007 on Miami's tranquil Fisher Island features Margraf book-matched marble in each of the 47 Mediterranean-style residences. Play tennis on private grass courts. Swim or sun on a mile-long private beach (the sand was imported from the Bahamas). From \$6.5 million;

Eighty Seven Park, Miami Pritzker Prize-winning architect Renzo Piano creates 70 sky villas, ranging from 4,000 to 7,000 square feet (below). Each has a large balcony with glass pocket doors—bringing the outside in. Venetian terrazzo floors echo the tranquility of Miami's white-sand beaches. From \$2 million; eightysevenpark.com.



The Pacific, San Francisco This Pacific Heights project offers 76 total residences, including 10 Row Homes (3 bedrooms; 3.5 bathrooms) and four Grand Penthouses (below). As an adaptive reuse building, the framework has 12-foot ceiling heights, expansive floor plans, and spectacular views. Gaggenau appliances and Arclinea cabinets. Hexagon Apartments, London This 15-story 1960s office building in Covent Garden is undergoing a complete transformation into 46 one-, two- and three-bedroom apartments. Car parking (essential in London) is provided in the basement. From \$2.4 million; hexagonapartments.com.
